10. Blair of that Ilk. Traces this family from William de Blair said to have died in reign of Alexander II early XIII century, down to XVIII century.
12. Brown of Knockmarlock. Starts with Richard Brown who purchased Knockmarlock soon after 1623, through his son, Robert Brown, and his (Robert's) daughter, Janet Brown, who married Robert Hodgert and bore Barbara who married William Findlay.
12. Hodgert. Starts with Revd. Robert Hodgert marrying Annabella Boyd and having son, Robert Hodgert, who married Janet Brown who had a considerable family including Barbara who married William Findlay.
13. Cunninghames of Brighthouse and Lainshaw. Dr. Findlay's mother, Barbara Hodgert, as a widow married Alexander Cunninghame. Accordingly this tree goes back two generations and continues after the said A.C. for a further six generations in the late XIX century.
- 14/15. Findlay of Easterhill and of Boturich Castle.
16. Handyside. An incompleted tree of William Handyside who married Jean, daughter of William Cunninghame of Lainshaw (page 13).
16. Haldane. An incompleted tree of James Haldane who married a daughter of William Cunninghame of Lainshaw (see p.13). A notice added saying:- Documents will be found in my deed box evidencing relationships as below set forth. Thomas Boyd of Pitcon was cousin of Robert Hodgert, and Andrew and George Brown were respectively brother and nephew of Robert Hodgert's wife; see pages 12 and 16. These documents are important as evidents.
17. Boyd of Pitcon. Commences with Robert 1st Lord Boyd. Temp James III; married Mariotta, dau. of Sir Robert Maxwell of Calderwood, and continues down through about six generations to Annabella who married Revd. Robert Hodgert, and continues on from her brother for about another four generations.
18. Hays of Smithfield Haystoun and Craignethan. Starts with John 3d Lord Hay of Yester whose eldest son became "of Smithfield" 1525; after five generations we come to Janet Brown who married Robert Hodgert and bore Barbara Hodgert who married William Findlay. There is a note saying that "Chirurgian Apothecary" was the invariable designation of one who combined the qualifications of surgeon and physician, and Hay of Haystoun (doubtless along with many others of as good status in Scotland) would have been surprised to think his descendants would have been ashamed of it.
